Priority 1: Traffic and Speed Control

- Investigate 20mph speed limit reduction for Main Street and Arnold.
 - o Address concerns of Arnold residents, who feel excluded.
 - Consider traffic calming measures such as speed watch programs and aesthetic, community-driven solutions
- Launch a "Speed Watch" project run by parishioners to monitor and promote safer driving.
- **Explore additional traffic measures** (e.g., signage, visual cues) to help control traffic flow and improve safety.

Priority 2: Green Spaces and Village Aesthetics

- Enhance green spaces and public areas with plantings, wildflowers, and bulb planting.
 - o Increase engagement through volunteer groups for planting and maintenance.
- **Improve verges and manage grass cutting** to improve the village's appearance and keep it tidy.
- Introduce planters and aesthetic street furniture (e.g., at village entrances and other strategic spots), building on past successes like the Tour of Britain cycle event planters.

Priority 3: Village Hall and Community Spaces

- Address the future of the Village Hall:
 - Apply for grants to refurbish or rebuild.
 - o Enable online booking and payment systems.
 - Ensure cleanliness and maintenance through regular inspections and penalties, if needed.
 - o Consider a two-tier pricing system to encourage more use by voluntary groups.

Priority 4: Communication and Community Involvement

- Improve communication with residents:
 - Better utilization of the Parish Council newsletter, including QR codes, bullet points of decisions, and actions.
 - Use Facebook and other platforms to ensure wider reach and engagement.
 - o Increase transparency on financial matters and ongoing projects.
- Ensure more inclusivity for Arnold:
 - o Ensure Arnold's needs are addressed in the agenda, with lobbying where necessary.
 - Consider filling the vacant seat on the Parish Council with an Arnold resident to better represent their needs.

Priority 5: Safety and Infrastructure

- Improve public safety:
 - o Improve parking in key areas, particularly around schools and busy streets.
- **Publish the Parish Emergency Plan** and ensure it is communicated and accessible to the public.

Additional Considerations:

• Encourage small community groups to apply for grants, and make sure the process is transparent and inclusive.
